# By Shuttle from Airport to Zagreb Central Bus Terminal

The scheduled airport shuttle, "Pleso prijevoz" operates between the Airport and the Zagreb Central Bus Terminal. This shuttle service is organized in such a way that it follows the airport timetable.



#### Access the Tram map from main Square to the Faculty:








#### **Gala Dinner Venue**

#### **Covid-19 information**

There are no longer any COVID-related restrictions for entry to Croatia.

Wearing protective masks is mandatory only in health services facilities including clinics, hospitals and social service centres. It is recommended but not mandatory to wear a mask indoors where larger crowds are expected.

#### Visa information

**EU/EEA citizens** need only a valid ID card (or passport) to enter Croatia.

**Third-country nationals that do not need a Schengen visa** can enter Croatia with a valid passport and then apply for the temporary residence permit in Zagreb. Please check at the <u>website of the Croatian Ministry of Foreign Affairs</u> if you need a Schengen visa to enter Croatia.

Third-country nationals that need a Schengen visa to enter Croatia (please check the <u>website of the Croatian Ministry of Foreign Affairs</u>) need to apply for it at the <u>Croatian embassy</u> / <u>VFS visa application center</u> before departing for Croatia.

You might need the originals of your "Letter of Acceptance" for your visa application; if so, please let us know as early as possible so that we can send it to you via mail in time and do also provide a shipping address.





# Zagreb electrical outlet and plug types

Zagreb uses power outlets and plugs of types C & F. Look at the pictures below to see what these plugs and power sockets look like:



The standard European plug. Commonly used in Europe, South America and Asia, but also in quite a few other countries. Plugs of type E and F will also fit in a type C outlet.



Used in almost all European countries and Russia. Also known as the Schuko plug. Plugs of type C and E will also fit in a type F socket.

# Electricity in Zagreb - voltage and frequency

All power sockets in Zagreb provide a standard voltage of 230V with a standard frequency of 50Hz.

You can use all your equipment in Zagreb if the outlet voltage in your own country is between 220V-240V. This is the case in most of Europe, Australia, the United Kingdom and most countries in Africa and Asia. If the standard voltage in your country is in the range of 100V-127V (which is most common in the US, Canada and countries in South America) you might need a voltage converter in Zagreb.

The standard frequency in Zagreb is 50Hz. If this frequency differs from the frequency used in your home country, please use caution when plugging in your devices. Please note we regularly check our electricity information with the <u>International Electrotechnical Committee (IEC)</u>
