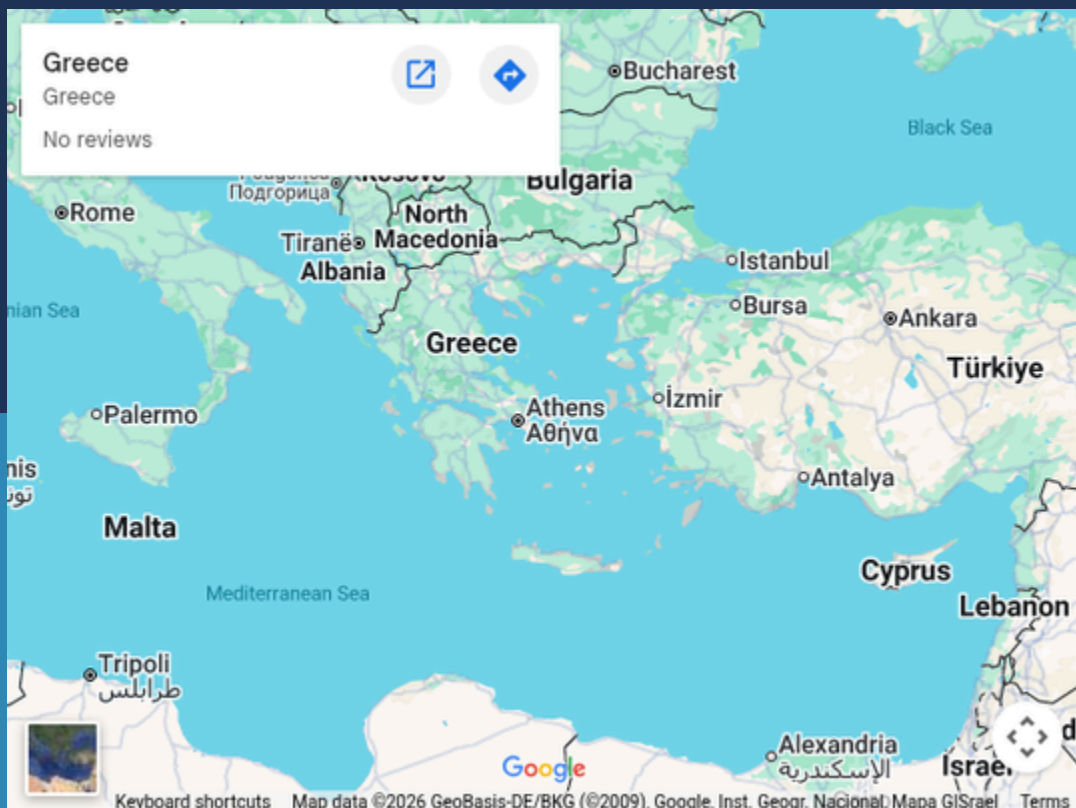

GENERAL INFORMATION ABOUT GREECE

Greece, officially the Hellenic Republic, is located in southeastern Europe, at the crossroads of Europe, Asia, and Africa. Known as the cradle of Western civilization, it is famous for its ancient history, rich culture, stunning landscapes, idyllic islands and superb food.

- **Capital:** Athens
- **Population:** Approx. 10.5 million
- **Language:** Greek (English widely spoken in urban and tourist areas), many signs are translated.
- **Government:** Parliamentary Republic
- **EU & Schengen:** Greece is a member of both.

GENERAL INFORMATION ABOUT GREECE

- **Weather:** in Athens, October temperatures average around 22–25°C during the day, with cooler evenings.
- **Water:** tap water is generally safe in Athens and large cities, but is recommended to buy bottled water on many islands.
- **Currency:** Euro (€)
- **Costs:** Affordable prices in Athens and large cities.
- **Payment:** credit cards (Mastercard & Visa) are widely accepted. Cash is useful in small businesses, it is best to withdraw cash from bank ATMs and to be charged in euros.
- **Voltage:** 230V / 50Hz
- **Plug types:** C and F





IMMIGRATION REQUIREMENTS

Foreign participants wishing to enter Greece must present a **valid passport or national identity card**, in accordance with their nationality and European Union regulations.

Participants may also be required to demonstrate the purpose of their visit, such as **conference participation**, and provide supporting documentation including accommodation reservations or return tickets. Immigration requirements are verified by the competent authorities upon entry into the country.

ARRIVAL AND TRANSPORTATION

Public Transport

Athens offers an extensive public transportation network, including metro, buses, and trams. The metro provides a direct connection between the airport and the city center.

Taxis / Ride-hailing services

Yellow taxis are available for a fair price all over the city. Authorized airport taxis and ride-hailing applications such as **Uber** and **Free Now** are also available.

TRANSPORT FROM ATHENS INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT (ELEFThERIOS VENIZELoS)

Athens International Airport (ATH) is approximately **33 km (20 miles)** from the city center. Several convenient options are available to reach downtown Athens or your hotel:



Metro

- **Metro Line 3 (Blue Line)** connects the airport directly to the city center.
- Key stops: **Syntagma, Monastiraki, Evangelismos**
- Travel time: approx. **40 minutes** to Syntagma Square.
- Operating hours: **06:10 – 23:30**, with trains every 30 minutes.
- Ticket cost: **€9 (one-way), €16 (round trip)**.
- The metro station is accessible via a pedestrian bridge from the airport terminal.



Airport Buses

- **Express buses** run 24/7 between the airport and key areas of Athens.
 - **X95:** Airport ↔ Syntagma Square (city center)
 - **X96:** Airport ↔ Piraeus Port
 - **X93:** Airport ↔ Intercity Bus Stations (Kifisos/Liosion)
- Travel time: **40–60 minutes**, depending on traffic.
- Ticket cost: **€5.50** (flat fare, one-way).
- Tickets available at the airport kiosk or onboard (cash only).



Taxi

- Available 24/7 from the designated **taxi rank** outside the Arrivals Level.
- Flat fare to the city center:
 - **€40 (05:00–24:00)**
 - **€55 (00:00–05:00)**
- Fare includes tolls, luggage, and VAT.

TRANSPORTATION IN ATHENS

Athens has a well-connected and affordable public transportation system that includes the **metro, buses, trolleybuses, trams, and suburban railway**. Below are the main options for getting around the city:



Metro

- The Athens Metro is fast, and efficient.
- It has **three lines**:
 - *Line 1 (Green)*: Kifisia – Piraeus
 - *Line 2 (Red)*: Anthoupoli – Elliniko
 - *Line 3 (Blue)*: Dimotiko Theatro – Airport
- Trains run approximately every 5–10 minutes from **05:30 to 00:30**, and later on weekends.



Buses & Trolleybuses

- Operated by **OASA**, buses and trolleybuses cover nearly every area of the city.
- Service runs from early morning (~05:00) until midnight.
- Some **night buses** are available on major routes.



Tram

- The **Athens Tram** connects the city center with the southern coastal suburbs, including **Glyfada** and **Voula**.
- Ideal for a scenic ride to the sea.



Suburban Railway (Proastiakos)

- Useful for reaching **Athens Airport, Piraeus port**, and cities like **Koropi** or **Ancient Corinth**.
- Less frequent than metro, but useful for certain routes.

INTERNET CONNECTION



Wi-Fi is widely available in hotels, cafés, and restaurants across the country. Many public spaces and transportation hubs also offer free Wi-Fi.

If you are European, Greece is an EU Member State, so the **roaming policy** applies. When you travel from your home country to another EU country, you do not have to pay any additional charges to use your mobile phone.

If you are not European, you can consider buying a local SIM card or an eSIM for a **4G or 5G connection** via [Holafly.com](https://holafly.com), [Airalo.com](https://airalo.com), or [eSIM.sm](https://esim.sm). It costs between 5 and 30 USD for a week.

RECOMMENDED PLACES TO VISIT IN ATHENS

SYNTAGMA SQUARE

Syntagma Square is the most central area in Athens, Greece. It is often considered **the heart of the city** and it is perfect for sightseeing. The origin of the name has an interesting history. During the night of the 3rd September 1843, a demonstration started right in front of the Greek Palace because soldiers and members of the public -gathered right on the large square- demanded that Otto give them a Constitution, or Syntagma in Greek. Now, you can visit National Gardens, the Old Royal Palace, a neoclassical building housing the Greek Parliament. Moreover, every hour, the changing of the guard ceremony takes place in front of the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier between Syntagma Square and the Parliament building. On certain days, this ceremonial event includes an army band and the majority of the 120 Evzones present at 11 am.





THE ACROPOLIS

The Acropolis in Athens is a must-visit for history enthusiasts, art lovers, and anyone intrigued by ancient mythology. This rocky hill has been inhabited since the **4th millennium BC**. The buildings that still stand today were constructed under the direction of Pericles in the 5th century BC. The Parthenon, the Temple of Athena Nike, the Propylaea, and others, are the remnants of the Golden Age of Greece. In particular, the Parthenon dominates the Acropolis. This is one of the most recognizable and imitated buildings in the world. It was built to honor the Greek goddess Athena Parthenos, the patron of Athens, and it is considered to be the most important surviving building of Classical Greece.

To complement this experience, the **Acropolis Museum** stands as the ultimate sanctuary for the treasures unearthed from this sacred site. Designed by Bernard Tschumi, the modern glass structure offers a breathtaking dialogue between the ancient ruins and the contemporary city. Inside, visitors can marvel at the original Caryatids and walk through the Parthenon Gallery, where the temple's frieze is displayed in its original orientation, under the same Mediterranean light that once illuminated it thousands of years ago. It is not just a museum, but a bridge across time that breathes life into the spirit of Classical Greece.



PLAKA

Nestled at the foot of the Acropolis, **Plaka is the most historic and charming district of Athens.** Often called the "Neighborhood of the Gods," it offers a unique journey through time with its maze of narrow cobblestone streets, neoclassical mansions, and ancient ruins. Visitors can explore the island-like alleys of Anafiotika, discover hidden Byzantine churches, or enjoy a coffee at one of its many traditional cafes. Just a short walk from the city's major conference venues and hotels, Plaka is the perfect place to experience the authentic atmosphere and timeless beauty of Athens.



MONASTIRAKI

Monastiraki is situated on the north side of the Acropolis and it is where the heart of city beats. The bustling flea markets, the Historic sites such as Roman Agora and Hadrian's Library, the picturesque churches, the Ermou Street which is a popular shopping district and the traditional greek restaurants create a blend of centuries and cultures. In addition, there is a great variety of cocktail bars which offer a wonderful view. Interesting information; "Monastiraki" means "**little monastery**" and owes its name to the Church of Panagia Pantanassa.





PIRAEUS

Piraeus is not just **Europe's leading passenger port**; it is a vibrant seaside city with a unique character. Just a short metro or tram ride from the center of Athens, Piraeus offers a refreshing maritime breeze and a rich tapestry of experiences. As you wander through the city, don't miss the iconic Municipal Theatre, a neoclassical masterpiece, or the picturesque harbors of Zea (Pasalimani) and Mikrolimano. For a true local experience, take a walk along the coast of Peiraiki to enjoy the sunset over the Saronic Gulf.

ATHENS RIVIERA

The Athens Riviera and its cosmopolitan hub, Glyfada, offer the perfect coastal backdrop for delegates looking to unwind after a day of sessions. Known for its sophisticated atmosphere, **Glyfada** is just a short drive from the city center, blending high-end business amenities with a Mediterranean seaside vibe. This vibrant southern district is home to an array of premium dining options and stylish cafes, ideal for informal networking or a relaxing evening stroll by the marinas. From the scenic Vouliagmeni Lake to the organized beach clubs, the South Suburbs provide a refreshing seaside escape that perfectly complements the professional energy of any international conference.



CAPE SOUNIO

Cape Sounio is one of Greece's most iconic landmarks, renowned for its breathtaking views of the Aegean Sea and the **ancient Temple of Poseidon**. Just over an hour from Athens, it offers a unique blend of natural beauty, history, and myth. Visitors can enjoy a stunning sunset over the ruins, making it a memorable highlight of any trip to Attica.
